To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing as a resident of Monterey Street to express my support for the proposed traffic circulation solution for Mariposa and Monterey Streets. The existing street configurations pose significant congestion and safety challenges, as evidenced by issues A, B, and C in the attached document.

I fully support the proposed one-way traffic plan, which would designate Monterey Street as uphill traffic and Mariposa Street as downhill traffic. Additionally, I am in favor of the proposed traffic-calming measures along Inyo and Mariposa Streets to manage traffic flow effectively and enhance safety. If feasible, I would also suggest configuring Mariposa Street with parking stripes similar to those on Monterey Street. This would help prevent the ongoing issue of illegal sidewalk parking along Mariposa.

Regarding the proposals for Solano Street between Monterey and Mariposa Streets, I strongly support Proposal One, which retains parking on the east side of Solano Street. Parking in this area is already limited, and its removal would increase demand on nearby streets, further constraining parking availability for other residents. This issue is particularly concerning because parking on this side of the street has already been removed north of Mariposa Street along Solano Street. Furthermore, during the summer months, parking becomes especially scarce as community members park along Solano Street to access the nearby community swimming pool, which limits parking for Solano, Mariposa, and Monterey Street residents.

Rather than removing parking, I recommend prioritizing safety improvements along Solano Street. Enhancing the existing west-side sidewalk by resurfacing it, improving crosswalks, and adding clear signage would address safety concerns while preserving parking availability.
