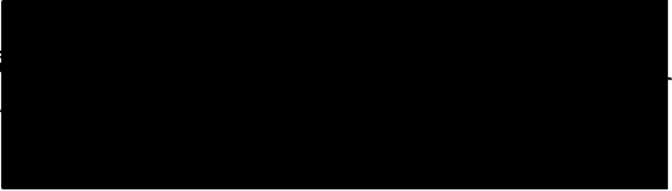

Jessica Aloft – Parks & Recreation Commission Application

What community activities are you presently involved in, or have been in the past?

I founded the Mothers of Brisbane with a group of moms in early 2004. We built a community of support for families in Brisbane that is still thriving twenty years on! I started the Tiny Tots Playgym through Brisbane Parks & Recreation, and ran it for 7 years. We also started a secondhand swap for kids clothing and baby gear, and family nights at local restaurants. We successfully advocated for the installation of changing tables at the community center and park bathrooms, and protective fencing along the street side of the community park. Later we worked to redesign and expand the community park playground, with the added element of 6 swings. In 2012, I was honored to receive the City's Volunteer of the Year award for this work.

Other community involvement includes living in central Brisbane and raising my three daughters here over the past twenty years. They all attended Silverspot, BES and Lipman schools. At Silverspot I was the board Fundraising Chair for 4 years, overseeing budgets, donations, and fundraising events. At Brisbane Elementary I was a parent volunteer in my kids' classes, and helped plan and staff many fundraising events. I also advocated for sound budgets to preserve programs and teaching positions, and keep class sizes small. I helped organize parents and community members to save Brisbane Elementary when it was threatened with closure during the financial crisis of 2009-10.

Finally, where would we be without Brisbane Dance Workshop – as my oldest said recently “BDW is Brisbane!” My girls grew up in BDW; now the older two and I participate in putting on the spring play every year, helping with costumes, stage management, and logistical support.

I worked in the non-profit sector for about 10 years, mostly with environmental non-profits. I wrote foundation grants for several years, so I understand that process, and what foundations are looking for. This could be helpful as we work to scope out a parks foundation for Brisbane.

I got my BA in Peace and Conflict Studies from UC-Berkeley, where I learned to think critically, and my MBA from Santa Clara University, where I learned to think strategically. My formal education and life experience have taught me a lot about unpacking root sources of conflict in order to find common ground – then it's all about rolling up my sleeves and getting things done!

Why do you want to be a member of the above Commission/Board?

I love this town! As a small city, we are lucky to have such well-developed programs and events. I would like to keep building on what we have, strengthening what makes Brisbane so special. Specifically, I would like to focus on these areas in the coming term:

Parks & Recreation Foundation – I would like to help set up a foundation to raise additional funds for Brisbane parks, recreation programs, open space management, and environmental education. Many other cities have these kinds of foundations to gather donations from the community for these kinds of programs. We have a broad base of support for parks and recreation investment in Brisbane, and I think residents would like the opportunity to contribute to improving our town in these ways. My professional experience in the non-profit sector could help get the foundation up and running.

Youth Outreach & Engagement – since the Teen Center's closure, there is no longer a dedicated place for young people to get together and connect with the community. I would like to help us do more to connect teens to each other and the community at large. Examples are increasing awareness of opportunities to be of service (tech teens at the Senior Center, LIT summer camp program, YAC), facilitating summer internships and seasonal hiring at local businesses, volunteering at City/community events, and teen-only events such as movie screenings, board game meet-ups, and night hikes on the mountain.

Events

- Halloween – I would like to discuss ideas for how to keep Halloween in Brisbane safe and fun for all. Considering that Brisbane is a destination for surrounding communities on Halloween, I think we should look at what supports might be useful, including overflow parking, pedestrian-only blocks, and enhanced lighting and police foot patrols. I would also like to explore ways to engage residents who want to participate but are outside the core downtown area, and on the flip side, residents who are overwhelmed with trick-or-treaters in the core area and could use a break. Lastly, I would like to look into creating a more accessible and family-friendly trick-or-treating destination at the community park. This could be geared toward kids 0-5 and their families, who have a harder time with the dark streets, crowded sidewalks, and many stairways in the central zone. It could also be geared toward including seniors and those with limited mobility in Halloween fun.
- Concerts in the Park – I would like to help seek community input on bands and types of music featured, bring back a local musician's day, and ensure that we get enough sponsorships to cover event costs.

What do you feel you could contribute to the Commission/Board?

- Energy and enthusiasm for continuing to make Brisbane a great place to be. I like to take the 100-year view and imagine what's possible for our wonderful little city.
- Positive outlook and a collaborative work style. I know most of the current commissioners and have good working relationships with them. I do my research, have a solid work ethic, and play well with others.
- Good knowledge of Brisbane city history and current programs, how the city functions, and familiarity with city staff and council members.
- Varied and multifaceted career experience. I have worked in non-profits, small businesses, and for myself, and am good at working in a team to reach creative solutions to complex problems.

More personally I enjoyed many facilities provided in Brisbane including being enrolled in after school Rec programs for the entire time I was in elementary school as well as being a part of the Brisbane Dance

Workshop. Over quarantine I fell out of the loop for a time but am now looking for a new way to get involved and give back to the community that helped raise me.

During college I started as a political science/philosophy major aiming for pre-law. While I opted to switch over to computer science for a more fitting career, I still have a solid foundation and understanding in the field. My experience working at Dogpatch games has taught me what it takes to run events and what tools are required to grow involvement in a community. I have experience running events for people of all ages from kids to corporate groups as well as spending time working with supervisor David Canepa and his team all over the bay area.

Why do you want to be a member of the above Commission/Board?

Growing up I enjoyed all of the things that brought me closer together with the community. Over quarantine it feels like I'm not the only one that has lost a lot of that connection to the community. From my perception participation has not fully recovered and I want to join in and help make sure we're able to preserve the origins of a lot of these events. To me this means

not only making sure the activities offered don't become diminished but that any changes and modernizations made hold to what made the event special to begin with.

What do you feel you could contribute to the Commission/Board?

While I do work and am a part time student, I work in the evening which means that during the day I can meet with city workers and members of other commissions to go over materials, work out details, and push projects forward, while they are engaged rather than needing to find a time both parties are free during their leisure time or after hours. My professional experience running events is not only limited to a professional setting. I did work with supervisor David Canepa, setting up, organizing volunteers, running booths at government events he ran. All together my years of experience with community engagement have allowed me to know what is needed and what issues may occur before the event starts. As a 21 year old I also bring a unique perspective on how young people perceive city events and engage with our community. This is also the perfect time for this opportunity as the commission is currently working on an outreach for young adults 16-24 which is a demographic I land right in the center of, and while I do hope to be a commissioner of my own right, having someone present in the room with that perspective would help the accuracy and speed of that projects completion.

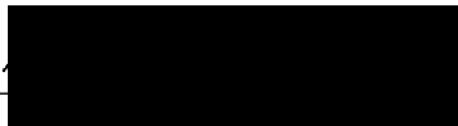

Why do you want to be a member of the above Commission/Board?

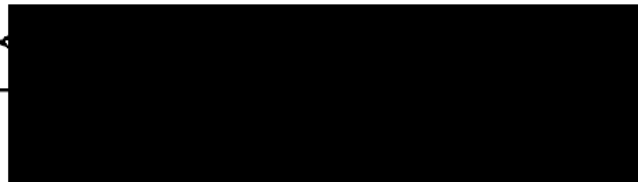

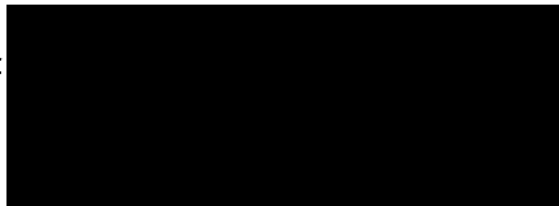

I have deeply enjoyed my time as a member of OSEC. Looking back I cannot believe how much time has passed. Time flies when you are having fun. It is an honor to grow and grow relationships with my current committee members. I feel I have been on the committee long enough to have some historical memory and to have become part of the core which keeps the committee functioning and moving forward.

What is most important to remember is that there is no "I" in team. I could not have accomplished all that I have without working with my fellow committee members. Back in 2014 we implemented the plastic bag and Styrofoam bans, planted trees, organized clean up days and the beginning of the Climate Action Subcommittee was formed to start working on Brisbane's first, belated and eventually award winning Climate Action Plan. We made a fresh stab at invasive species by updating the Planting Guide as part of education and outreach. I lent a special effort to both the CAP and combating invasive species by writing short articles for publication in the Star.

In 2015 I worked with the Brisbane library to secure a corner for OSEC to create a central source of information for the community. I requested that City Council ban fracking in Brisbane as a symbolic gesture and connected the OSEC with Bike to Work day which fit neatly in with our other initiatives. I was also the liaison for OSEC to the Lipman Science fair where I initiated a new award for displays that used simple non plastic materials and creative reuse. I felt it was important not only to applaud the science being done, but the material way in which it was presented. It is a wonderful award because it is accessible to all students with all types of gifts and continues to be presented as part of the fair.

2016 the CAP subcommittee spent a great deal of time working on the Purchasing Guide for the city. When we originally began working on it, I envisioned not only a guidance document, but also an employee database where people from different departments could share information about what products were working best for them and the "greenness" of various items could be listed and taken into account so that efforts wouldn't have to be duplicated multiple times. This is similar to what I did when I organized an eco-school supply program. I would still like to make this happen. I think learning from each other would allow us to move up the ladder with each step rather than horizontally.

2017 was about supporting my other committee members and continuing the effort to move forward trees and beat back invasive species. One new effort was trying to bring a car share program to Brisbane, and we worked on an EV charging station. I also had my personal business certified as a green business and brought that information forward to the committee and the community at large.

In 2018 I had the opportunity to dabble in many things. I provided information and support with the committee for the solar on city hall. I contributed key ideas to the Zero Net energy study, the sign board replacement, and street light replacement. We saw the fruition of the work on the EV charging station and began to work on the Building Energy Ordinance in earnest which we hope will be one of our greatest achievements in carbon reductions for the city of Brisbane.

One effort that has always been there, sometimes in the background and sometimes in the fore, is to plant more trees in Brisbane. One of my goals is to see the tree inventory come through and work with the city to identify appropriate places for new trees and to see a Friends of the Urban Forest type program in place. When we rewrote the Tree Removal ordinance I couldn't shake the feeling we had missed something. The loss of poplar tree on Plumas shone a spotlight on our failure to protect roots and other problems. I know it's a pain since we just did it, but I want to revisit and repair this before we have another big loss.

We also took credit for a gas powered lawn equipment ban when we accepted the Beacon award for our climate action plan. The idea originated with the Baylands, which was forced to ban gas powered lawn equipment in order to come even close to meeting the emissions per capita thresholds set by BAAQMD. I thought if it's both necessary and mandatory in the Baylands, then we should implement it city-wide. I believe we still need to follow through on this promise to the environment. I know this will not be popular, but I volunteer as tribute. ;) I'm willing to do the dirty work and take the flames that this is bound to bring down by working with citizens to understand what aspects are most volatile and what we can do to ease this program in through a gradual transition.

I am also currently working with San Mateo County Office of Sustainability to host a Master Class on Sustainability. I took the course myself a few years ago and really enjoyed it. I wanted to bring it to our community. Because of the size and potential draw of Brisbane, it wasn't a good fit for their budget. I decided to volunteer my time to teach it. Everything is almost set to go; I just need a space, and might have to wait for the completion of the new library before I can put this into action.

I also have some things I feel I need to accomplish in the Green Building space. I have an idea for something simple that I feel will greatly impact the process. I have taken classes from and worked with BayRen to bring a workshop to Brisbane but there is more to do. Having talked with professionals in the field and worked with a team on projects myself, I know that the problem is not our laws, which are some of the most aggressive in the nation, but rather our problem is one of legacy. I have some unique ideas that I think would help address this problem without requiring more codes, rules or legislation.

This is important because we are running out of time. One of the things I did last year was attend the Climate Action Planning Conference in San Luis Obispo. This was my second conference and each one has been both shocking and enriching. One of those Eco-bombs was that 2019 was the last year we could produce and sell new cars with internal combustion engines and make the climate goals we have set out for ourselves. Because of the time lag between research, bureaucracy, legislation, implementation and action, these are the years that matter most. What we set forth now, will determine our course for the next decade and what we do over the next decade will determine the shape of our existence.

This is why I am so passionate about teaching, sharing with my community and working to push Brisbane's policies as far forward as I can. I am so proud to be part of this city because Brisbane has consistently been out front on these issues. I want to stay a part of that engine. Let's not break the incredible momentum we have. I'm sorry this turned into such a tome. I wanted to look back over what I have accomplished and set new goals and expectation for myself.

I see all this as not an ending but a beginning, a chance to do more. I continue to attend classes, webinars and conferences. I'm looking forward to the possibility of teaching this year and working through difficult and challenging issues with my fellow committee members and my community. My habits of reading, writing and research has kept me informed and at the forefront of emerging environmental issues. I hope to make my next four years as productive as the preceding years.
